We Seek to Imitate St. Joseph's **Humility and Immediate Obedience**

Dear Friends of LAMP,

It is a wonderful grace for all of us to have this year be universally dedicated to St. Joseph by the Catholic Church. Over these months, many of us have reflected more deeply on his place and role as a "spiritual father", read articles or books about him, even made a Consecration to St. Joseph. A LAMP prayer to and drawing of St. Joseph was enclosed in LAMP's last Newsletter. A homeless couple who came to the LAMPcafé walk a few steps away from the truck and immediately open the New Testament that they received, and began reading it together.

Recently a young woman, we'll call Serenity, came to the LAMPcafé as we were parked and serving near her shelter where she lives in the S. Bronx. We offered her a sandwich and LAMP's little red card that states, "You are precious in God's eyes." (Cf Is. 43:4)

She looked at the card and exclaimed: "Oh, I have one of those! Someone gave one to me a while ago when I stopped by here." She began to tell us that she had just been released from the hospital after a couple of weeks being very sick with Covid. She said that right before she got sick she had stopped by the LAMPcafé and one of the LAMP Missionaries had given her a "precious" card, along with a lunch, and kindness. At that time she wrote the date on the back of the card and put it in her pocket as a reminder that someone believes in her. She said it was the first time in a long time that she had experienced that.

When she was taken to the hospital, she had no identification on her, just the "precious" card in her pocket. She was in a coma, known only as "Jane Doe." When she woke up, the first thing she saw was that precious card placed right next to her on her hospital tray. She still has it.
